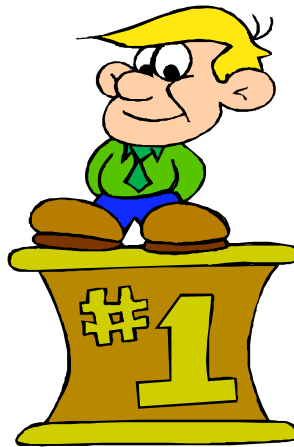

OFFICERS JOB DESCRIPTIONS

It is once again time to begin thinking of running for one of our offices and committee chairmen. I have outlined via our policies and by-laws the job description here within this article.

Please take a few moments to review and then contact Steve Buckley if you are interested in assuming and thus directing the future of our wonderful organization.

President

The president shall be the principle executive officer of the corporation. He/She shall, in general, supervise and control all the business and affairs of the corporation and sign such contracts or other instruments which the membership of the organization has

authorized to be executed.

Vice President

In the absence of the president or in the event of his/her death, inability of refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the president and in so acting shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the president. The vice president shall perform such other duties and activities as may t

Secretary

The secretary shall #1 keep minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors and the membership of the organization, #2 see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of the by-laws, #3 be the custodian of the corporate records, #4 keep a register of

the post office address of each member of this organization, which shall be furnished by the secretary to any member upon request, #5 and to in general, perform all duties incident to the office of secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the president or the membership of the organization.

Treasurer

The treasurer shall #1 have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds of the corporation, receive and give receipts for all monies due and payable to the organization from any source whatsoever and to deposit all monies in the name of the corporation in such banks or other depositories as shall be determined by the board of directors or the members of this organization and #2 to in general perform all duties incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the president or the membership of this organization.

IPP/COB—Immediate Past President

The immediate past president shall convene the nominating committee to elect officers for the following year and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the president or membership of this organization.

1. President—a. up to two(2) members in good standing. The member or members nominated to serve as president is/are to be informed that if elected he/she is also elected and expected to serve as a Trustee of the Oregon JCI Senate Foundation for the term he/she is elected to serve as President of the Oregon JCI Senate.
2. Vice President—a. up to two(2) members in good standing other than #1.
3. Secretary—a. up to two (2) members in good standing, other than #1 or #2.
4. Treasurer—a. up to two (2) members in good standing other than #1, #2, #3.
5. Foundation Trustee at large—a. A member in good standing nominated by the current Trustees of the Oregon JCI Senate Foundation.

Notice of those nominated shall be submitted by mail to the last known address of all members in good standing with this organization not less then two (2) weeks prior to the annual meeting.

The 2009 Annual Meeting of the Oregon JCI Senate will be held on April 17, 18 and 19, 2009 at the Oregon Garden Resort in Silverton, Oregon. The Oregon Garden Resort has been completed and is now open for business. All 102 of the guest rooms have been finished and are ready for you. The lodge is absolutely breathtaking. Lynn and I had dinner at the restaurant and it was great. The lounge is amazing with a large fireplace right in the middle. I am sure you will all be impressed with the resort. I have 40 guest rooms reserved for April 17 and 18, 2009 under the name of the Oregon JCI Senate. You have a choice of a king size room, a queen size room or a double queen size room.
